How did you get where you are today?

I do not have the typical background for environmental education – my degree was in Business Management. The environmental education sector is highly competitive so I would recommend gaining as much practical experience as possible.

What project are you most proud of?

(Re)Love Our Stuff – This is a project I ran when I started with Keep Britain Tidy. I designed the content of the project, recruited schools and had three East London Schools set up their own second-hand clothes shop in school.

What's your favourite game or activity?

I love kayaking and have started attempting to go down white water rivers which is terrifying and really exciting at the same time!

What's your favourite eco-place in London, and why?

Bedfords Park in Havering. It is a fantastic place to be, full of wildlife and I have many great memories of running environmental activities there.

Do you have a recommendation to LEEF members?

I would recommend that LEEF members challenge themselves to try something new as much as possible!

What are you working on at the moment?

I am currently working on encouraging East London Schools to engage with and participate in the Eco-Schools programme.

How would you like to see Environmental or Sustainability Education develop in the next 10 years?

I would love it if all schools have some form of environmental education and for pupils to spend a significantly higher amount of school time outdoors.
